From adversity came innovation and resilience in 2021-22. As we navigated the COVID challenges of the past year we've taken a fresh look at everything from moving into a new location to refining existing services (i.e. more car repairs than direct donations) to meet emerging needs.

The pandemic also brought a whole new set of challenges along with it, from used car prices skyrocketing and a shortage of used cars to fewer cars being donated. We rolled with the changes and put a strong emphasis on repairing existing cars and keeping them on the road for our working families.

In addition to ensuring that we are keeping those wheels turning, we had wonderful support come our way through an angel donor who provided the funding to help us secure our new office location. Additionally, Santander Consumer USA came on board providing the funding for our property security. Together, this will help expand our mission and our social enterprise. Our new location has ample space to keep and sell our cars on the premises, is close to nearby partner repair shops, and has space for an area where we can add a detail component for not only our cars, but for paying customers as well.

During this fiscal year, Wheels of Success provided 39 cars, 26 repairs and 17 other car related services. Thanks to your continuing community support, we are finding new ways to transform lives by helping to keep working families working in Tampa Bay.

OUR MISSION

Wheels of Success is dedicated to providing personal transportation solutions by partnering with the community in a circle of support to keep people working and sustain their independence.

OUR BEGINNINGS

Wheels of Success was incorporated in June payments, down payments and car-care classes

ELIGIBILITY GUIDELINES

Applicants must be working full time (at least 32 hours a week) or have a verifiable job offer to be considered and must be above poverty level.

STATUS

Must be employed and facing transportation issues getting to and from work or unable to return to work due to transportation issues. Proof of employment required via one of the following forms:

- Employer verification
- Pay stubs (2) verifying employment
- W2 form from the previous year
- Written offer of employment on company letterhead



Families with Child(ren)—Single Parent (Mother or Father) or an underemployed Couple with Child(ren)

Underemployed Working Poor who have no dependent children

Moderate Income Families who have no liquid resources and have suffered a catastrophic life situation such as:

- abusive relationship
- accident
- death of spouse
- divorce
- fire
- hurricane
- illness
- loss of income
- youths aging out of foster care

REFERRALS:

Must be referred by one of the following sources:

- Employers
- Social Service Agencies
- Religious Institutions
- Board Members

STIPULATIONS

- Must attend Wheels of Success car care class to be considered for assistance
- Must sign a contract indicating their commitment to remain employed
- Must agree to pay monthly interest-free minimal payments, based on income, and provide three service hours per month to the organization for one year
- Must provide valid Florida driver's license
- Must obtain full coverage insurance
- Must complete exit survey about the impact of participation in the program upon completion of their obligations



2003 to help families obtain or continue work by providing them with reliable transportation through a program of car repairs, vehicle replacement, related licensing services, car in Hillsborough, Pinellas and Pasco counties.

INCOME:

Up to 250% above poverty level and not receiving government assistance other than:

- Unemployment Compensation
- Medicaid
- Food Stamps
- Section 8 Housing
- Food Stamps

Our Programs & Services



VEHICLES FOR VETERANS

Helps veterans re-enter the workforce after serving our country. Our Vehicles for Veterans program, started with funding through State Farm in 2009 with continuing annual support, makes it easier for veterans to keep the jobs they have, get the medical care they need and keep them from sliding into homelessness.



WHEELS TO THE FUTURE

Our Wheels to the Future program, started by Joe Clark and the Eckerd Family Foundation, specifically targets young people aging out of foster care and unaccompanied youth who lack support from family members as they start adult life on their own. We provide that all-important "first car" because safe, reliable transportation is an essential component in continuing their education and supporting themselves.



ROAD TO INDEPENDENCE

Helps domestic violence victims escape their abuse with reliable transportation. Victims of domestic violence include men, women and children of all ages. Without a car, these women and men feel trapped because they often have to depend on their abuser to transport their children to school and medical appointments.



CARS FOR CAREGIVERS

Direct Care Workers ("DCW") struggle to get to and from work. It is difficult to deliver good care to their patients when one is worried about how they will pick-up their children from school, whether they will be laid off if their car breaks down one more time, or when one has to walk through Florida heat and rain to get to work.



Our Work

BUILD-A-CAR

Wheels of Success' BUILD-A-CAR program allows individuals or teams to "adopt" a car to get it road ready. The average cost to repair and recondition a donated car is \$3000.

- \$35 provides an oil change & air filter
- \$100 buys a tire with balancing
- \$200 replaces brakes
- \$400 replaces a water pump
- \$500 replaces 4 tires with balancing & alignment
- \$1500 buys a transmission
- \$2000 replaces an engine



CAR CARE CLASSES

Wheels of Success' Car Care Class teaches all aspects of owning and maintaining a car, including how to obtain the right insurance.

Topics also include the mechanics of an engine, how cylinder compression makes the engine go, what causes a head gasket to fail and what happens when it does. It includes other car care lessons such as not driving on flat tires as it can damage the rims, regular rotation of tires, and carrying a bottle of water in the car in case of overheating and much more. Many of our Car Class graduates have reported that the lessons they learned saved a vehicle or prevented



expensive vehicle repairs. At the end of the class, each student takes a Car Care Class quiz to reinforce the lessons learned. Then students receive a brief summary of types of insurance coverage available to drivers, as full coverage insurance is required.

Grant S. is no stranger to overcoming challenges. His story stands out, even among the hundreds of lives that a car from Wheels of Success has impacted. His dedication to his goals, his gratitude toward those who assist him and his perpetually positive attitude are inspirational. Grant doesn't simply get by with his

diagnosis of being high functioning on the autism spectrum, he's thriving!

Grant was referred to Wheels by Ready for Life, an organization providing support to young adults transitioning out of the foster care system. He was finishing up high school and wanted to continue his education and study computer networking and IT in college. Unfortunately, his lack of transportation made it impossible for him to attend his school of choice. Public transportation meant a nearly 2-hour trip, each way, for classes.

This "Build-A-Car," funded by Tomlin St Cyr Real Estate Services, was able to provide a "new to Grant" Honda Civic and put him on the road to success. The car has allowed him to get to school in record time (under 30 minutes!) while also allowing him the freedom and mobility to get to the doctor, the grocery store, and other appointments. Grant has already achieved a number of IT certifications and he'll soon be finishing up his last two classes for his degree.

Grant's been the model Wheels of Success client. His dedication to volunteering is second to none. He's filed, packed, cleaned, organized and moved boxes on behalf of Wheels. His energy and enthusiasm are contagious, and he's always calling to see what else he can help with.

Grant's also proof that Wheels is making a difference with our required Care Care Class. In addition to regular preventative maintenance like oil changes and tire safety, the class teaches the importance of paying attention to the dashboard warning lights. Grant was able to identify a leaking radiator hose before any overheating or radiator damage could happen. If you ask him, he'll readily say, "That Car Care Class saved my car- No doubt about it." Don't be surprised if you see Grant in his red Civic for many years to come.


TYPES OF SERVICES

BY PROGRAM




